REMARKS:

On March 30, 2021, I conducted an incident response inspection at the Vivan Harbison Well Site in Nottingham Township, Washington County. The inspection was conducted in response to a reportable release received on 3/24/2021 (CTS 355496). The initial report indicted that approximately 40 gallons of produced water was spilled to the well pad.

At the time of inspection, I observed a roll off box dated 3/24/2021 and liquid material located on the steel plates under the gas production units located on the south side of the well pad. According to the EQT representatives on site, the spill on 3/24/2021 was stopped and remediation began. The liquid material I observed was related to a new spill discovered shortly before I arrived on site. The 3/24/2021 spill occurred from the GPU 592603B. The release that was discovered prior to my arrival on site appeared to emanate from GPU 592605A. According to the SPSI representatives the spill that occurred on 3/24/2021 was remediated and the impacted material was placed in the roll off box awaiting disposal.

I recommend that the Operator investigate the possibility of moving the GPUs and investigate impact that the spill had on the material under the GPUs. I noted that that the latest spill is the latest in a series of spills that have occurred between 10/5/2020 sand 3/25/2021 at this well site and all have been associated with separate GPUs on site. The GPUs are currently under and COA related to secondary containment and recommend if possible that these GPU be moved up the list for placement of secondary containment due to the frequency of spills associated at the site specifically related to the GPUs. SPSI indicated that the Operator would be utilizing act 2 for remediation.

No impact of waters of the commonwealth observed or suspected. The spills appeared to contained to the gravel well pad surface.

Violations are being issued based on my observation made during the inspection.




